



- **1. HIGH PRECISION TEMPERATURE ADJUSTER:** High precision temperature adjuster is used; it is called thermostat. Temperature range can be fixed with this according to the kind of material being ironed.
- 2. THERMAL FUSE PROTECTING: When the working temperature exceeds its normal zone, the fuse will melt automatically, and cut off the power supply. When such failure happens, it must be sent to its service agent in order to avoid a hazard.

- 13. When using an extension cord with your appliance, make sure the extension cord is correctly wired, and rated for its use.
- 14. This product is intended for household use only.
- 15. Do not attempt to repair the applaince yourself; instead, take it to Sunflame owned or Authorized Service Centre for repairs.
- 16. Save these instructions carefully.

USAGE



BEFORE USING YOUR IRON

- Your iron is to be used for indoor domestic usage only. Before using for the first time, check if the voltage rating on the base plate corresponds to the mains voltage at your home.
- Some parts of the iron have been slightly greased and as result the iron may smoke slightly when switched ON for the first time. After a short while, however, this will cease.

IRONING TIPS:

- Sort the articles to be ironed according to the fabric. Ironing instructions
 are usually stitched onto and inside seam of the garment and those
 should be followed at all times, start your ironing with the fabrics
 requiring the lowest heat setting.
- 2. If you are unsure of the fabric content of a garment, test a small area (a seam or inside hem) before ironing.
- 3. Set the appropriate ironing temperature indicated in the ironing instructions or in the fabric table by means of the thermostat dial.
- 4. Pull open the cap of water tank inlet, fill water into water tank until it reaches the "MAX" position. Water capacity is 150g.
- 5. Press the cap back to its original position to avoid any leakages.
- 6. Turn the temperature regulating knob to the "0" position, ensure the iron standing vertically is on the smooth and stable place. Now insert the mains plug into the socket and switch on. Indicator light will start to glow.
- After about 1.5 to 3 minutes, the iron will be ready to use once the indicator light has switched off and steaming will start after adjustment of steam knob to desired level.
- Press the steam button, the steam will spurt continuously (you can use it in vertical or flat position). If you want to stop, just turn off the steam button

- During ironing, if local area on cloth needs more steam to remove creases, you can press Spray button by pointing the nozzle in desired direction and water will get sprayed.
- 10.If there is no steaming, it means there is no water in water tank. At this moment, you must turn OFF the steam button. If you want it to continue ironing, pull out the plug first, then fill in water in tank. Put the mains plug into the socket and after re-heating you can continue to use iron.
- 11. After ironing is complete, turn the temperature regulating knob to "0" position, pull the mains plug out of the socket. If iron is not going to be used for a long period of time, please empty the water tank out and then turn the temperature regulating knob to the "MAX" position and switch on the iron. Press the steam button repeatedly, till steam stops coming out. This method is used to prevent any remainder water inside boil off box, thus preventing damage to steam function.

- 12.Do not abuse the cord. Never carry the appliance by the cord of yank it to disconnect it from the outlet; instead, grasp the plug and pull to disconnect.=
